



Students Ending Slavery

College Chapters – Events Guide

Each chapter should develop a plan for the year that reflects the interests, passions and abilities of members. For example, if you have members that are singers, musicians or poets hold a local concert or poetry night to benefit FTS at your school's coffee shop. Here are some ideas that are simple and easy for any chapter to organize:

Mission + A Meal

Host a community supper at your university, school cafeteria or local restaurant. Ask a local food vendor to donate a meal and invite other students, friends and family to hear about Free the Slaves' mission- to liberate slaves around the world & change the systems that allow slavery to exist- and how students can help. Attendees can make a donation to the organization in place of paying for their meals (\$21 to \$36 as a symbolic gesture for the 21 to 36 million people enslaved around the world).

Fund an Abolitionist

Free the Slaves works on the ground to help rescue and reintegrate those that are in slavery and to cut off slavery at the source. Organize a fundraiser or donate to help us pay the salary of a liberator who risks his or her life to go on the frontlines and rescue slaves. Host a Trivia Night

Choose a venue that allows for students under 21 to participate, a local restaurant or café. Ask the manager if you can host a monthly trivia night with three different rounds, including one round that has questions about modern-day slavery. Require a small entry fee as a donation to FTS.

***Note on Fundraising:**

Financial Accountability- Funds raised by an official FTS chapter must be used for chapter activities or be transferred to FTS in support of eradicating slavery. FTS chapter funds should not be given to other organizations. Most schools will allow student organizations to open an account for depositing funds raised during the years. Check with your financial affairs office for details. Funds remitted to FTS can be sent by check or money order from the school or from a private account.
